

COMMUNITY ROADWATCH HADDENHAM NEWS MAY 2017

Since our last article about Community Roadwatch, I thought you would like to know what we have been doing to make Your community roads a safer place for residents and other road users alike. Firstly, so far in 2017, we have helped James Morris, your CRW Coordinator, to carry out no less than 7 sessions during which we monitored the speeds of 1107 vehicles, found 350 speeding at 5 mph or more over the limit (and we sent out 20 letters to the companies of speeding commercial vehicles asking politely for our concerns to be brought to the attention of drivers in the hope they will slow down. Our powerful CRW database – designed by McSoft(UK) - collates events by company as well as vehicle registration. Consequently, any speeding trends can be quickly identified and if not corrected we are able to escalate our concerns to the appropriate MD/CEO. A summary of our 2017 results for Haddenham up to 30 May 17 is shown below with area results being available on our website – just Search for Community Roadwatch(UK):
