

COMMUNITY ROADWATCH (CRW) HADDENHAM NEWS TO 30 SEP 2017

In Aug/Sep, we continued our '2017 Wheelie Bin Sticker Road Safety Campaign' and issued more FREE Mick George-sponsored stickers along New Road and Station Rd and MLH Transport Ltd-sponsored stickers along West End. We still need some help to get everyone 'stickered' in Hill Row 40 zone and at the top of West End. Please note that we do not post these expensive CRW-owned sponsored stickers (85p each) through doors but personally call on each residence. If you are on a monitored route and have not received these stickers please let us know. Also, if you have stickers but have not yet put them on your bins, please do so asap or ask us to do so for you or return them to James for re-allocation. Please note the copyright stickers must be applied 'as issued', not given away, not cut or defaced in any way nor fixed to posts/poles. CRW reserves the right to remove misplaced or defaced stickers to meet its obligations to the District Council that has permitted us to place these stickers 'whole' on their bins.

Also in Sep17, CRW took possession of a powerful passive Data Logger (no bigger than a bag of sugar) that when strapped to a lamppost can record the |Date|Time|Speed |Type of vehicle| 24/7 IN BOTH DIRECTIONS AT ONCE. The Logger was used in West End and then New Road before being strapped to a telegraph pole for a couple of days in Sutton Rd with the assistance of James Morris. More to follow to justify the Parish Council's case for this to be a 30 zone.

Sutton Rd has been added because of the danger to families (with young children) trying to cross the road there as shown below and recognised by the Parish Council that, despite the apparent lack of official support, is attempting to reduce this dangerous stretch over the brow to 30 mph and get a proper footpath installed in place of a rough roadside verge or unlit track.
